Our Evolving Church

As a result of discussions among the members and leadership, we've done some "tweaking" of our organizational structure, including officially changing our name, our mission, and how we elect (and recall) our leaders.

The current Presiding Bishop and CEO, Rev. Alan R. Kemp, filed Articles of Amendment with the Washington state Secretary of State codifying these changes.

Our unofficial name had been the Ascension Alliance for some time. Now, it's official. We have also been aware that part of the organization's mission has been to be a home for the remnants of Archbishop Herman Adrian Spruit's Catholic Apostolic Church of Antioch-Malabar Rite. So, we put a clause in our Articles of Incorporation formally declaring that the organization would serve that purpose. We have also created three bodies within our organization: a Board of Governors, Council of Bishops, and General Assembly. Perhaps the biggest change, however, is breaking-out the responsibilities of CEO and Presiding Bishop.

Effective Convocation 2012, we will elect our Presiding Bishop for three-year terms. Nominations will come from the General Assembly (clergy, seminarians, and "enrolled" members). The bishops will vote on the nominations and send two names back to the membership for a vote, which will conclude at Convocation. The Presiding BIshop will be our spiritual leader, Chair of the Council of Bishops, and Co-chair of the Board of Governors.

In addition, members of the General Assembly will elect one of its own to serve a three year term on the Board of Governors.
